### Endoscopy on the Move: Preparing for the Next Decade

#### COURSE DESCRIPTION

This year's course was created to provide information on a diverse yet commonly encountered group of topics. The array of topics presented is designed to appeal to attendees with all levels of endoscopic expertise, and the panel of speakers are well recognized content experts with significant experience in delivering balanced presentations. Topics range from innovative endoscopic techniques in submucosal endoscopy, to everyday topics such as colonoscopy quality measures and techniques. The course will also cover important pancreaticobiliary topics such as indeterminate biliary strictures, as well as a session on premalignant lesions of the GI tract, including gastric IM and pancreatic cysts. We have also included a "potpourri" session on endoscopic reprocessing, bariatrics, ergonomics in endoscopy and GI advocacy. To enhance audience engagement, there will be an audience response component to the course, and the lunch program will allow attendees to meet the speakers and enjoy discussions about challenging cases and techniques.

- ✓ Recognize applications of submucosal endoscopy in daily practice.
- ✓ Characterize current and new techniques in biliary endoscopy.

- ✓ Improve day-to-day operations of endoscopy practice.
